Survivor Story

Louise Lassiter

While living in Harford County, MD at age 65 I went for my yearly mammogram and was surprised to get a recall. After my follow-up appointment the radiologist told me that they had found a lump in my right breast. After researching doctors and upon the advice of a dear friend who was a nurse, I made an appointment to see Dr. Neil Friedman, Director of the Beast Center



at Mercy Hospital in Baltimore. After a biopsy and confirmation of breast cancer we had big decisions to make – lumpectomy or mastectomy, reconstruction or none. As with most of us survivors, my husband and family played a big part in my decision making and follow-up care. I chose to have a right mastectomy followed by chemo treatments. During this time, we had custody of our 2 granddaughters, at the time ages 8 and 10. There were lots of questions from them, but we also look back at the funny episodes. Like the time I answered the door and forgot to put on a hat or wig. Their little friend on the other side of the door was shocked seeing me with no hair and immediately went running back home! All went well and life got back to normal.

After retiring, we chose to make Ocean Pines on the Eastern Shore our fulltime home. I still return to Mercy Hospital for routine mammograms and checkups. Upon moving to Ocean Pines, I connected with WSW and attended various meetings and social events.

After living at the beach for 18 years, we moved back to Harford County to be closer to family. Years go by quickly during retirement but surviving for 5-10-15 years makes you complacent and recurring cancer does not pop into your subconscious as much as it previously did. However, just before Christmas 2018, I discovered a lump under my armpit. I immediately contacted my nurse and directly following that, I had a needle biopsy done. As the test showed positive for breast cancer, I was scheduled with Dr. Neil Friedman at Mercy. After 21 years as a cancer survivor I was again facing surgery and follow-up treatment. Dr. Friedman removed 2 masses and a node from my right armpit. This was followed by a 6-week regimen of radiation (no chemo this time, thank goodness!) and daily Letrozole medication. I have been blessed with experienced, competent, caring and compassionate medical staff at both Mercy and the Kaufman Cancer Center in Bel Air where I received radiation. My family has been very supportive, and I am blessed to be feeling healthy again.
