MEDICAL UPDATE

HONEYBEE VENOM CONTAINS CHEMICALTHAT KILLS BREAST CANCER IN MINUTES

STUDY SHOWS:



NEDLANDS, Australia — A groundbreaking discovery in Australia is giving new meaning to the term natural remedy. Using hundreds of honeybees, a new study reveals the venom in these insects' stingers quickly kills breast cancer cells.

Dr. Ciara Duffy says honeybee venom destroys multiple types of breast cancer, even the hard to treat triple-negative variety. Her study in the journal *npj Precision Oncology* finds the venom not only eradicates these cancers, it also breaks up a cancerous cell's ability to reproduce. It also contains a compound called *melittin* which researchers say helps this natural remedy <u>stop the disease</u> with remarkable speed.

1Tbsp Olive Oil 1 Garlic Clove Minced

1 Tbsp Ginger grated 1 Tbsp Crushed Red Pepper

1 Lb Ground Turkey 3 Tbsp Lime Juice

1 Tbsp Fish Sauce 1 Shallot Thinly Sliced

1/2 Cup Cucumber Peeled; Seeded; Diced 1/2 Cup Mint Chopped

1/4 Cup Basil Chopped 1/4 Cup Peanuts Chopped

SURVIVOR'S STORY



My name is Lindsay, and I was diagnosed with stage III breast cancer at the young age of 30 during the height of the pandemic in May 2020.

I had no family history, and I discovered the bump one day when I got out of the shower, I had no symptoms, and I was too young to receive yearly screening. I immediately made an appointment with primary care physician, and they honestly didn't think it was anything serious at my first appointment.

I pushed for a mammogram, and they said immediately after I needed a "emergency biopsy". The following day, My doctor called me to confirm it was cancer.

I had chemo, double mastectomy with reconstruction and radiation. Its amazing how naïve I was about cancer and how long this journey would be, BUT I am so thankful to still be here fighting!



Forward Focus"Therapy Program

WSW is proud to continue our mental health "Forward Focus" Therapy Program. Breast Cancer survivors having difficulty handling current life situations may take advantage of this program. WSW has partnered with Congruent Counseling Services, LLC and Dunahoo Psychological Associates, LLC. to provide up to 5 individual therapy sessions for current survivors. After the initial 5 sessions, survivors may continue with therapy if they so choose using their own insurance.

These therapy sessions will be done through telehealth. They are available for WSW breast cancer survivors who reside in the state of Maryland.
