# **Nutritional Information**

**Lentil Soup** 

This lentil soup is a great option for individuals having trouble swallowing. It is also a warm cozy soup perfect for fall and the holidays.

#### Ingredients:

- 2 tbs olive oil
- 2 shallots, minced
- 4 carrots, sliced
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp pepper

- 2 sweet potatoes, diced
- 2 coups low sodium broth
- 2 sprigs fresh rosemary
- 1 cup dry lentils (green or brown)
- 2 cups chopped kale



#### **Directions:**

- 1. Thoroughly rinse fresh produce under warm running water for 20 seconds.
- 2. Heat a large pot over medium heat. Add olive oil, shallots, and carrots, and cook until carrots begin to soften. Add garlic and ¼ teaspoon each salt and pepper. Cook until vegetables are tender, 4 to 5 minutes. Add sweet potatoes and remaining ¼ teaspoon each salt and pepper. Stir and cook an additional 2 minutes.
- 3. Add broth and rosemary, then increase heat to medium high. Bring to a rolling simmer. Add lentils. Reduce heat to low and simmer, uncovered, until lentils and potatoes are tender. Add kale, stir, and cover. Taste and adjust flavor as needed.


